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Reedbed & Fen

Reed bunting and reed warbler. Purple. Gold or brown.

Fill-in-the-gaps

Fen is marshland which is fed by alkaline water.

Swallowtail caterpillars pupate in autumn, spending winter and early spring in their chrysalises low in the reedbed.

Today we cut the fen here purely to maintain the habitat for specialist plants and animals.

Pairs of great crested grebes perform elaborate courtship dances in early spring.

After breeding, adults lose their dramatic head plumes for winter.

In winter the open water of Ranworth Broad is home to visiting waterfowl, including teal, wigeon, gadwall, pochard and a **roost** of **cormorants**.
